The Vision of National Education Policy is to provide high quality education to develop human resources in our nation as

global citizens. Sree Narayana Guru college Chelannur has implemented multidisciplinary education by introducing a series of knowledge building and skill development exercises for students like Ripples multi disciplinary seminar series, various club activities which includes discussions and peer teaching sessions in class rooms. Leadership qualities and self discipline developed in our students by making them actively participate in social extension activities like NSS and NCC units. The students also engaged in community services . All the departments of our college already offer open courses with an interdisciplinary approach and the students of any discipline are free to join them out of their individual interest. Teachers of the institution have undertaken a series of orientation sessions and refresher courses conducted by Human Resource Development Centres of UGC in which they have been invariably introduced to the New National Education Policy. In order to enhance the recommendations of NEP various clubs functioning in the college provide opportunity for the overall development of the students in sports, arts and literary.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institution has made the decision to enhance technical support for the successful implementation of the Academic Bank of Credits. To achieve this, the e-governance software used by the institution will undergo further updates to incorporate the provisions outlined in the draft of the National Education Policy (NEP). These provisions aim to facilitate multiple entry and exit points within academic programs. An innovative aspect of this initiative involves enabling students to earn and deposit credits through participation in national schemes such as SWAYAM, NPTEL, and V-Lab. The Academic Bank of Credit will also serve as a mechanism for credit transfer and accumulation, empowering students to earn credits and successfully complete their programs. Sree Narayana Guru College is committed to adhering to the curriculum and structure prescribed by the affiliating University of Calicut. Additionally, in alignment with the NEP, the college will embark on the launch of new skill-based and vocational courses. These courses will be designed to offer credits affiliated with the University of Calicut, ensuring that students receive a well-rounded and flexible educational experience that meets both academic and industry requirements.

17.Skill development:

Sree Narayana Guru College, Chelannur is affiliated to the University of Calicut and it follows the curriculum provided by

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the university. The college offers Add on courses in, Latex for Beginners, Research Methodology, English for Effective Communication, Money and Banking, etc. The institution follows the footsteps of Sree Narayana Guru, the great saint and social reformer of Kerala, whose motive was to imbibe strength through organization, and seek liberation through education. A Sree Narayana Study Centre functions in the college to develop a humanistic, ethical and non violent culture among students. The college has already made collaborations with major institutions in the locality and industrialists to design programmes that provide vocational skills to the students.

Sree Narayana Study centre, functioning in the college propagates the teachings of Sree Narayana Guru who is revered for his Vedic Knowledge. Several spiritually enlightening seminars and lectures are organized by the Study Centre. Initiatives are taken by the institution to promote Indian languages like Hindi, Sanskrit and Malayalam. Programmes including webinars and seminars are offered to encourage Hindi, Malayalam and Sanskrit learners. From 2020-21 onwards, the institution offers MSc Biology with molecular Medicine and Virology as specialization which is introduced as a new generation course by the University of Calicut.

Sree Narayana Guru Chelannur college has 7 UG departments, 4 PG departments following the syllabus of University of Calicut. The faculty members of our college have their representation in Board of Studies, and they actively participate in the framing and evaluation of various programme outcomes. The students and the faculty members are informed and updated at the institutional level about the ongoing programmes and courses and their outcomes, under the leadership of IQAC. The Program outcomes and course outcomes are communicated to the students and teachers properly and it is updated in the college website. Each year college handbook is distributed to the students which contains all the courses and programs organised by the college. College level orientation program are organised in the beginning of each year to familiarise the new students with the rules and regulations of the college. To achieve the positive outcome college takes the measures to execute the course and course outcomes.

20.Distance education/online education:

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Upholding the concept of optimum utilization of resources, teachers of the institution were motivated and encouraged by IQAC to take ICT enabled sessions in the classrooms making use of their own laptops and other technological gadgets. As a part of this a new program named ICT enabled digital interactive session (ICTEDIS) was launched in the college from 2020 onwards. Each department conducted classes updating the latest innovation in their subjects with the help of ICT sessions. Sree Narayana College affiliated to the University of Calicut has been successfully functioning as the examination centre of Distance Education Centre, University of Calicut for more than a decade. The infrastructure facilities of the college as well as the service of the teaching and non-teaching staff are adequately provided for the smooth conduct of the distance education examinations. The College also have a IGNOU centre functioning in our college providing distance education to numerous number of students.

Sree Narayana Guru College functions as an affiliated institution under the University of Calicut, delivering primarily the curriculum designed by the University. As an affiliated institution, the college adheres to the pattern designed by the University. The college rigorously follows the academic guidelines set by the university. At the same time, we constantly endeavour to realise our vision by working on the framework of university education. The college follows the academic calendar provided by the University. The staff council prepares an outline of the academic activities. The IQAC and CBCSS monitoring committee ensure systematic implementation of the curriculum. The staff council in consultation with the IQAC prepares the institutional academic calendar in tune with the University academic calendar to facilitate an effective academic atmosphere.

Teacher evaluation by students is conducted in each semester and teachers are advised about the strength and weakness of their teaching methods. Class wise parent teacher meeting are conducted to ensure effective feedback for the proper curriculum delivery. Curricular planning is further ensured by the participation of faculty members in Board of studies. Faculty members of different departments have been participating in syllabus revision workshop and are part of question paper setting of University exams.

The college offers various Add on courses like Introduction to discrete mathematics, Business research methods, Mushroom cultivation, First aid and safety education, English for effective communication, Economics of money and banking, Latex for beginners and Sahithya Rajana to inculcate value based and professional skills in students.

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The institution follows the calendar issued by the University strictly and plans all its activities including the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE). The institute prepares an institute-level academic calendar and subsequently every department prepares its calendar. Internal Assessment tests (IA), assignments, seminars and Class room participation based on attendance are part of the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) of students. There is a well-defined process for the conduct of CIE as per the calendar of events. The faculty members prepare IA question papers based on scheme of evaluation and approved by the department Head. The internal assessment test timetable is prepared by the internal examination committee and circulated to students and staffs one week before the commencement of the test. The evaluation of answer scripts are carried out by respective Course Instructors and the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) grades are published by the concerned departments. The Principal, through the academic committee meetings, frequently reviews these mesteprogress and provides suitable suggestions.

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

Sree Narayana Guru College Chelannur follows the curriculum prescribed by the University of Calicut which includes various chapters covering cross cutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability.

All undergraduate students are required to study Audit Courses on Environment Studies, Disaster Management, and Human Rights and Gender Studies. Human values are addressed through the course "Ways with Words: Literatures in English" offered in the first semester UG common English course. Human Values and Gender are addressed through the courses "Naveena Malayala Kavitha", "Drishyakalasahithyam" and "Malayala Novel Sahithyam" offered in the third Semester and fourth Semester B.A Malayalam programme. Human values, Gender and Professional Ethics are addressed through the course "Signatures: Expressing the Self" offered in the third semester UG common English course.

Importance of Non conventional energy sources like solar energy, wind energy, energy from ocean are addressed in the course "Non Conventional Energy Source" offered in the fifth semester B.Sc Physics open course. Environment and Sustainability is addressed through the course "Environmental Science" offered in the sixth semester. The course "Management Concepts and Business Ethics" offered in the first semester B.Com programme helps students to understand the importance of ethical business practices. Apart from this, the institution frequently conduct seminars, debates and invited lectures on various topics concerned with human rights, social values, gender and sustainability.

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Advanced and slow learners are identified by the interaction with the students as well as their parents and based on their performances. Students are further identified accordingly based on their attentiveness in class, performance in different activities assigned to them, tutorial sessions and results of internal and university examinations. Those who need extra support are identified by corresponding tutor and are offered remedial classes. Peer learning groups are organized to enhance their confidence. They are motivated to actively participate in alternate methods of learning like co-curricular and extracurricular activities that boost their learning skills. Advanced learners are given special assignments, and are prescribed additional textbooks. Advanced learners are encouraged to attend Government run programmes like ASAP. Post Graduate students are given advice to focus on research. They are given opportunities for NET/JRF coaching, mock tests, seminar presentations, workshops, INFLIBNET, interaction with resource persons etc. These diversified activities cater to the needs of the heterogeneous student population of the institution.

Internal assessment is conducted for all the four semesters of the PG courses and the six semesters of the UG courses. For the purpose of internal marks consolidation, internal examinations, based on the University examination model are conducted and the answer sheets are evaluated. Assignments and seminars, submitted and presented by the students, make up the second and third component of internal assessment. The final component is based on the classroom performance of the students, related to their attendance in class. The timely submission of assignments and proper presentation of seminars are insisted upon to make the students aware of the importance of internal assessment. The students are informed properly about the need to attend all the

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internal examinations.

After the conduct of internal exams, the students are shown the valued papers so that they can understand the modifications they have to incorporate to prepare for the University exams. Opportunity is provided for retests for the students who missed the internal exams due to genuine reasons. The attendance percentage of each class is informed to the students at regular intervals to make them aware of the status of their attendance. The topics for assignments and seminars are provided sufficiently well in advance so that students get ample time to prepare their presentations. Those students who have attendance issues are contacted by the departments concerned, and their parents are also informed about the attendance percentage of their wards. This is done to redress the grievances related to attendance and make the students attend the classes regularly, and perform well in both internal and university exams.

The Institution has adequate facilities for teaching - learning as per the stipulations of the Calicut University Act 1975. External and Internal funds have been utilised to set up adequate facilities for Teaching - Learning to provide quality education. The Planning Board, College Council and the IQAC regularly take stock of the infrastructural needs and provide the necessary inputs to the Management. The fund for infrastructure includes UGC, Management and PTA. RUSA fund of 2 crores had been utilized for a new PG block. With 67 acres of land in its possession the Institution offers adequate infrastructure facilities for curricular and extracurricular activities. The college is having 35 class rooms in which 15are ICT enabled and 6 are well

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equippedlaboratories. A seminar hall and an outdoor auditorium is maintained to host programs. A well-organized library stacked with books, e- resources like N-LIST, e-journals etc. are functioning from 9:30 am to 4: 30 PM. A co-operative store also functions to provide study material. The physical amenity facility includes counseling cell, common girls' room, canteen, gymnasium, carroms and chess boards and playground such as football ground, volleyball court etc. They all are functioning & maintained under the physical education department.

Searching and retrieving books are made fast and easy by using computerized catalog service, providing bibliographical information about the documents and its availability in the library. The students are able to search , know the status of a particular document and reserve a document online. It is possible through KOHA Cloud hosting. The library uses barcode technology for speedy issue/return operations. INFLIBNET arena with 10 computer is also functioning in the library. INFLIBNET provides e-books, ejournals, doctoral theses etc through N-LIST. Students and Teachers can use this NLIST program for their academic improvement. A Library Committee functions for conducting various programmes for the benefit of the students. The Library also provides orientation programmes.

The institution has a healthy financial audit system with regular internal and external audits. The internal audit system is two tiered, the first tier comprises of the Account Clerk, Head Accountant and Office Superintendent whereas the second tier is the internal audit cell/core committee (Principal and teaching staff). The transactions in the cashbook is checked by the Office Superintendent, and countersigned by the Principal after verification with the aid of the Internal Audit Cell. Consequent to authentication of audit by external Chartered Accountant utilisation certificate is issued. The utilisation certificate is submitted for scrutiny to Accountant General and Deputy Directorate of Collegiate Education, Kozhikode. The audit wing of Deputy Directorate of Collegiate Education visits the institution and peruses the files and corresponding supporting documents. Institution responds to audit objection with corroborative evidence. Any inadvertent discrepancy is immediately resolved by the institution. The audit report of PTA account is prepared and presented before the Executive and General Body for approval. Further, external Chartered Accountants assigned by the Sree Narayana Trusts conduct an elaborate audit of all files, receipts, and cashbooks annually or before the end of a Principal's tenure, thus ensuring a smooth functioning financial system in the institution.

At the conclusion of each semester, the Department conducts an annual evaluation, bringing together all faculty members to assess the comprehensive development of the Department across various dimensions. These dimensions include result analysis, faculty meetings, programs organized with eminent personalities, details of conferences/workshops/seminars hosted by the department, faculty contributions in the corporate sector, and challenges faced by the department. The Principal thoroughly reviews the semester's activities and provides recommendations for further enhancement.

SNGC ensures the regular assessment of results after each semester, with the IQAC overseeing the entire result analysis process. The analysis entails a systematic report on the pass percentage of students, examining their performance in each subject for the respective semester. This report encompasses details such as minimum and maximum marks secured, the average percentage of marks attained by students, and the classification of marks into low, moderate, and high categories. Additionally, the report highlights outstanding students along with the pass percentage for each department. The outcome of the result analysis prompts each department to conduct a systematic analysis, identifying various shortcomings.

Furthermore, there has been an increased integration of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) in teaching practices, empowering all teachers to adapt to new technologies. Notably, two faculty members have obtained Ph.D. degrees during this period, while several others have registered and actively engaged in research pursuits.

The college believes in sustainable development and follows a green protocol policy inside the campus. The college has also taken strict measures against plastic usage inside the campus.

Boards are kept in several strategic locations. Water cooler installed in convenient places. Circulars and signboards on the restriction of plastic usage and directions on the usage of cloth banners, digital banners, and soft binding methods inside the campus have helped a lot in practicing green protocol policies. Paper waste is renewed beautifully into paper craft materials under the guidance of NSS. Separate dust bins are placed. Cleaning drives are undertaken under the guidance of NSS as a part of the environmental promotional activities. Chemicals are neutralized after usage and then they are disposed into the ducts in diluted form. The e-waste materials are repaired and reused in our institution to the optimum extent. The irreparably damaged computers and computer accessories are handed over to the management for further intervention procedures. A Biogas plant is installed on the college campus through which all biodegradable wastes are converted into biogas and the same is used to generate fuel for cooking purposes in the canteen. The slurry/manure from the plant is further processed through vermicompost and is used for organic farming. Water coolers placed inside the campus are an initiative towards water conservation as the contaminated well water is made potable through a multi-stage reverse osmosis system and muti-stage filtration method.

The college is a coeducational institution situated in an economically backward and rural area Kozhikode district emphasizes on ensuring the participation of students as well as of the local people in the programs of the college. The Entrepreneurship Development Club of our college organized a Mushroom Cultivation Training for Kudumbasree workers in Chelannur Grama Panchayath to generate an alternative income for many women agripreneurs in the area. The resource person of the program Dr Abhilash, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany guided the kudumbasree members on how to start a small mushroom farm in their own home, from where they can collect mushroom seed. Similarly, free drinking water testing for the residents around the campus was conducted by the Department of Biology to educate the good owners on the importance of maintaining the quality of water. A proper solution to eradicate bacteriological issues found in water was also advised as part of thisprogram. 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The Institution has adequate facilities for teaching - learning as per the stipulations of the Calicut University Act 1975. External and Internal funds have been utilised to set up adequate facilities for Teaching - Learning to provide quality education. The Planning Board, College Council and the IQAC regularly take stock of the infrastructural needs and provide the necessary inputs to the Management. The fund for infrastructure includes UGC, Management and PTA. RUSA fund of 2 crores had been utilized for a new PG block. With 67 acres of land in its possession the Institution offers adequate infrastructure facilities for curricular and extracurricular activities. The college is having 35 class rooms in which 15are ICT enabled and 6 are well equippedlaboratories. A seminar hall and an outdoor auditorium is maintained to host programs. A well-organized library stacked with books, e- resources like N-LIST, e-journals etc. are functioning from 9:30 am to 4: 30 PM. A co-operative store also functions to provide study material. The physical amenity facility includes counseling cell, common girls' room, canteen, gymnasium, carroms and chess boards and playground such as football ground, volleyball court etc. They all are functioning & maintained under the physical education department.

The library has a separate collection of books for competitive examinations. The library has been fully automated with KOHA library automation Software, 22.11.12.000 version in the year 2023. All the functions of the library are automated using this software such as cataloging, data entry, circulation, stock verification and OPAC [Online public access catalog]. Searching and retrieving books are made fast and easy by using computerized catalog service, providing bibliographical information about the documents and its availability in the library. The students are able to search , know the status of a particular document and reserve a document online. It is possible through KOHA Cloud hosting. The library uses barcode technology for speedy issue/return operations. INFLIBNET arena with 10 computer is also functioning in the library. INFLIBNET provides e-books, ejournals, doctoral theses etc through N-LIST. Students and Teachers can use this NLIST program for their academic improvement. A Library Committee functions for conducting various programmes for the benefit of the students. The Library also provides orientation programmes.

The internal audit system is two tiered, the first tier comprises of the Account Clerk, Head Accountant and Office Superintendent whereas the second tier is the internal audit cell/core committee (Principal and teaching staff). The transactions in the cashbook is checked by the Office Superintendent, and countersigned by the Principal after verification with the aid of the Internal Audit Cell. Consequent to authentication of audit by external Chartered Accountant utilisation certificate is issued. The utilisation certificate is submitted for scrutiny to Accountant General and Deputy Directorate of Collegiate Education, Kozhikode. The audit wing of Deputy Directorate of Collegiate Education visits the institution and peruses the files and corresponding supporting documents. Institution responds to audit objection with corroborative evidence. Any inadvertent discrepancy is immediately resolved by the institution. The audit report of PTA account is prepared and presented before the Executive and General Body for approval. Further, external Chartered Accountants assigned by the Sree Narayana Trusts conduct an elaborate audit of all files, receipts, and cashbooks annually or before the end of a Principal's tenure, thus ensuring a smooth functioning financial system in the institution.

Boards are kept in several strategic locations. Water cooler installed in convenient places. Circulars and signboards on the restriction of plastic usage and directions on the usage of cloth banners, digital banners, and soft binding methods inside the campus have helped a lot in practicing green protocol policies. Paper waste is renewed beautifully into paper craft materials under the guidance of NSS. Separate dust bins are placed. Cleaning drives are undertaken under the guidance of NSS as a part of the environmental promotional activities. Chemicals are neutralized after usage and then they are disposed into the ducts in diluted form. The e-waste materials are repaired and reused in our institution to the optimum extent. The irreparably damaged computers and computer accessories are handed over to the management for further intervention procedures. A Biogas plant is installed on the college campus through which all biodegradable wastes are converted into biogas and the same is used to generate fuel for cooking purposes in the canteen. The slurry/manure from the plant is further processed through vermicompost and is used for organic farming. Water coolers placed inside the campus are an initiative towards water conservation as the contaminated well water is made potable through a multi-stage reverse osmosis system and muti-stage filtration method.

The Entrepreneurship Development Club of our college organized a Mushroom Cultivation Training for Kudumbasree workers in Chelannur Grama Panchayath to generate an alternative income for many women agripreneurs in the area. The resource person of the program Dr Abhilash, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany guided the kudumbasree members on how to start a small mushroom farm in their own home, from where they can collect mushroom seed. Similarly, free drinking water testing for the residents around the campus was conducted by the Department of Biology to educate the good owners on the importance of maintaining the quality of water. A proper solution to eradicate bacteriological issues found in water was also advised as part of thisprogram. Besides helping poor and needy students overcome their academic hurdles, the Department of English conducted a one-month course in Communication Skills in English forthe students of SN Trust High School. Therefore, it can be said that the college providesquality education and opportunities to students as well as to local people for their intellectual and emotional growth through different programs that are relevant and responsive to the needs of the rural and educationally backward society of this region of the district.
