Institutional Distinctiveness 2019-20

The Postgraduate Department of English, Sree Narayana Guru College, Chelannur, conducted a short-term course in Communication Skills in English, for the high school students of Sree Narayana Trusts High School, Chelannur. This was a three-month course conducted during July, August, and September. Classes were held weekly once, on Wednesdays, from 3.20 pm to 4.00 pm. A batch of 25 students from various high school classes was selected for the class, according to the interest expressed by the students. This year, emphasis was given to the development of the reading skills of the students. The students were given passages for loud reading and their pronunciations were corrected. The students were also briefly introduced to the concept of Phonetics. Practice sessions were given in which the students were asked to repeat some words to obtain the correct pronunciation. At the end of September, an oral examination was conducted to assess the pronunciation of the students.



The Department of Botany, Sree Narayana Guru College, Chelannur along with IQAC offered free drinking water testing program for the private well owners who reside around the campus. This extension activity aims to promote drinking water testing and to educate the good owners on the importance of maintaining the quality of water. This academic year 10 water samples were collected from different open wells around the campus. Students of the Botany department collected the samples and analyzed the physical and chemical quality of water using 15 different parameters. Reports were created under the supervision of Dr. Abhilash E, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, and the report was also issued to these Well owners within a week of analysis. Most of the open wells had pH issues and solutions were suggested to the good owners when the reports were issued to them.

Local communities face a severe shortage of masks, as we are undergoing the lockdown. Some associations and social clubs were initiated to educate people to make and use masks at their homes.
