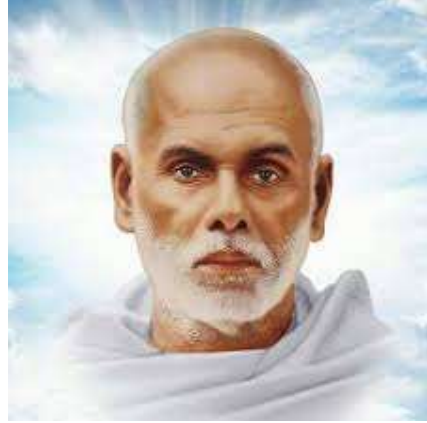

Introduction

With great pride and delight, we present this annual report of Sree Narayana College, Chelannur, as an authentic record of our activities and achievements during the academic year 2013-2014. Through projecting our accomplishments and drawbacks, we intend a self-assessment of our strengths and weaknesses. We also hope that this report would inspire us for an introspection to overcome our hurdles, resolve our drawbacks and work harder to be more productive and promising in all areas of activity, so that our institution can scale greater heights of glory in the years to come.

The Academic Committee constituted by the college council, comprising all Heads of Departments, one elected members of the staff, designed the academic plans for the academic year by charting a detailed Academic Calendar, in the beginning of the academic year itself. All academic activities were scheduled and conducted as prescribed in the calendar.

The College Council constituted various clubs and forums each under the supervision of a convener with 3-4 faculty members. ORIENTATION PROGRAM

Cloth Bag Distribution

On 15th December, as part of limiting the use of plastic bags, 300 cloth bags were distributed among students, teachers, and neighboring community of Chelannur. P. M. Ravindran, SN Trust executive nominee of the SNG college inaugurated the event. Principal Dr. V. Devi Priya spoke at the function. Dr. Anusmitha N., SEED coordinator and SEED student coordinator P Shannad coordinated the program. The cloth bags were made from bed sheets collected from students and teachers.

Break the Chain (Covid 19) – Mask Distribution

In a joint effort by the SEED club and Forestry club of SNG College, 2000 masks were made and distributed in Primary Health Centers, Grama Panchayath offices, police stations, fire force offices, and gas distribution



agencies, socio- forestry offices, neighboring shops, and in petrol pumps.



Protective masks are said to lower the chances of coronavirus entering the respiratory system through droplets that are present in the air. This is called source control. This recommendation is based on the role of respiratory droplets play in the spread of the virus that causes COVID-19, paired with emerging evidence from clinical and laboratory studies which shows how masks reduce the spray of droplets when worn over the nose and mouth. COVID-19 spreads mainly among people who are in close contact with one another, so the use of masks is particularly important in settings where people are close to each other or where social distancing is difficult to maintain.

INSTITUTION BASED VEGETABLE HARVESTING

As part of the Jeevanai Program of Government of Kerala, vegetables were planted by SEED club and on 14th of February, vegetables were harvested. Different types of vegetables including brinjal, green chili, banana, tapioca, peas, cabbage, cauliflower, spinach, cucumber, elephant foot, colocasia and ladies finger were harvested.



The harvested vegetables were distributed among neighboring community of Chelannur. A major share of the vegetables was used in the hostel kitchen. Mathrubhumi News covered the event and presented it as a documentary. This report was telecasted on Mathrubhumi News channel.



Padheyam – Food Distribution Program

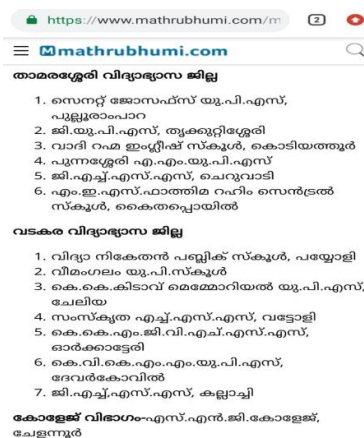
NSS unit of SNG College started the food distribution program titled Padheyam on World Food Day in 2014. From 2019 onwards, the SEED club members continued the initiative as part of SEED club activities. In 2019-2020 academic year a total of 1800 food packets were distributed. Each student prepared around 2 lunch boxes and the SEED club volunteers spend almost 4 hours distributing the food packets in the premises of Calicut city.

This is a weekly program and the SEED club members distribute lunch once every week among the poorer section of the society including the beggars and sick people. The SEED club members decided to continue this program throughout the year.



Haritha Jyothi Award

SNG college SEED club won the Haritha Jyothi award for building the best vegetable garden on the premises of the ladies hostel.



Love Plastic

In order to limit the use of plastics, a unique program was launched in the ladies hostel of SNG College. As part of the program, Dr. Anusmitha N, SEED club coordinator talked about the harmful effects of plastics. She said that chemicals in plastic which give them their rigidity or flexibility (flame retardants, bisphenols, phthalates and other harmful chemicals) are oily poisons that repel water and stick to petroleum-based objects like plastic debris. So, the toxic chemicals that leach out of plastics can accumulate on other plastics and harm the environment.



To avoid the use plastics, plastic collection boxes were placed in and around the hostel. The plastic waste thus collected was handed over to collection centers for recycling. The plastic garbage was collected and segregated based on their type. The Mathrubhumi plastic collection centre helped the SEED club to conduct this program.

INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATION TECHNOLOGY ENABLED DIGITAL INTERACTIVE SESSION

IQAC of our college took initiative to a best practice called “ICTEDIS”. Through this initiative, the college aims to ensure a digital interactive session for all students on a regular basis. With the help of the ICT enabled class rooms the students get an opportunity to understand the concept by use of text, sound, video and images thereby transforming learning process for the better.





Forestry Club

Forestry club of Sree Narayana Guru College have an excellent team of student volunteers. For the academic year 2019-20, as part of the forestry club activity, students started preparing the Biodiversity register of the campus including Kalarikunnu hills. 44 plant species were documented so far including IUCN Red listed *Pogostemon quadrifolius*. 26 fauna are also documented including 10 butterflies, 3 dragonflies etc. Studies are delayed due to Covid

Nature club organized Environmental pollution awareness campaign. The members conducted one day environmental pollution campaign at Calicut city on November 20, 2019.

The campaign was inaugurated by College Principal Dr Devipriya by giving N95 Masks to the cleaning staff of the college. In connection with the campaign the student members of Nature club supplied N95 masks to the office staff and cleaning staff of Sree Narayana Guru College, Chelannur and to the traffic police at the different signal points in Kozhikode.



BHOOMITHRASENA CLUB

Waste Management System

Bhoomithrasena club of Sree Narayana Guru College, Chelannur had already adopted a sustainable approach to waste management by constructing a 'waste management plant'. As around 70% of the students bring lunch from home, the Club constructed a waste management plant to convert the food waste into manure and the manure thus obtained was used to cultivate vegetables.

The plan was implemented in three steps. As part of the first step, the building for placing the plant was constructed with the help of NSS and College management. The waste management plant was supplied by 'Niravu Vengeri', a residents association known for its creative interventions in waste management in and around 12 grama panchayats in Kozhikode. The second step was the installation of the plant. Three waste bins (one for food waste, one for biodegradable wastes other than food waste, and the third one for plastic waste) were supplied in each floor of the college. Students were assigned to collect the waste on a daily basis in the afternoon, thereby disposing it to the baskets allotted. After three months, the food waste converted into manure was used to cultivate vegetables.



GROW BAG DISTRIBUTION AND AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON ORGANIC FARMING

Bhoomithrasena club of Sree Narayana Guru College, Chelannur distributed filled grow bags and seedling to the natives of Chelannur to prepare a vegetable garden at their home, in an attempt to spread awareness on the importance of organic farming. Formal inauguration of the programme was done by Principal, Dr.Devipriya V on 11 February 2020. Mrs.Shini.M, Convener, Bhoomithrasena club delivered the welcome address. Smt. Nimisha Babu Raj (Assistant Professor, Dept. of Physics), Sri. Jithesh C.P. (Assistant Professor, Dept. of Political Science), Smt. Vandana Viswanath (Assistant Professor, Dept. of English) were present during the occasion.

Potting mix was prepared by mixing soil, coco peat and cow dung in 1:1:1 ratio which ensures good drainage and air flow for strong root growth in 'grow bags'. The seedlings were

bought from 'Niravu', Vengeri. The seedlings include, chilly, lady's finger, tomato, brinjal, beans etc.



FOLKLORE CLUB

Arippom Thiropom Workshop

Folklore club and Malayalam Department jointly organized a workshop for the students of the college on 9th September, 2019. The purpose of the workshop was to bring back

memories of forgotten folk art forms and teach the younger generation the importance of folk art forms. Dr. Deepesh Karimpunkara, Head of the Malayalam Department, addressed the gathering on the importance of folk art forms in our lives. He also elaborated how folk art forms are inherent in modern lives. Dr. MK Bindu, convenor of the Folklore Club led the program. The students participated in different folklore games like Kannupothikali, kudukudu, kulam kara, Nariyum Puliyum kali, Thottu Kali, Musical Chair, Hide and Seek. In the Musical Chair program, teachers also participated along with students. These types of games provided mental and physical entertainment for the students.



WALK WITH SCHOLAR REPORT

SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME

The Scholar Support Programme (SSP), an initiative of the Government of Kerala, is a student enrichment programme which functions in the Government and aided colleges across the state. The programme aims at providing support to uplift the academically backward students. In our college, 2 batches were allotted for the year 2019-2020. The first batch consisted of 40 second year degree students, who had enrolled during 2018-19, and the other batch consisting of 40 first year students from 2019 admissions. 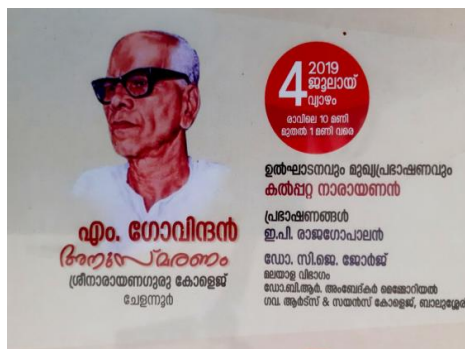

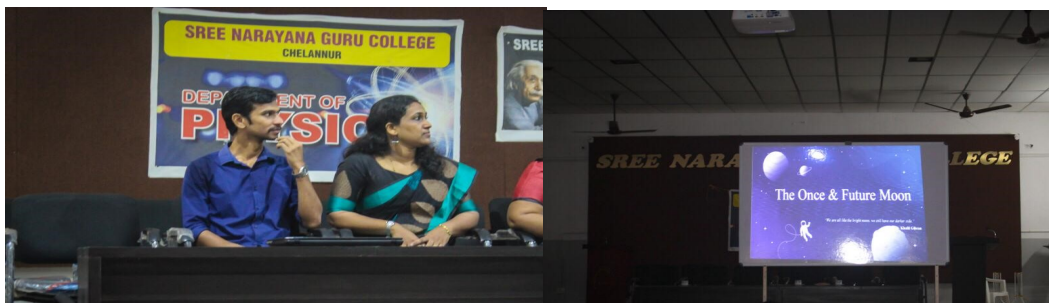


DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

Flood Relief Campaign

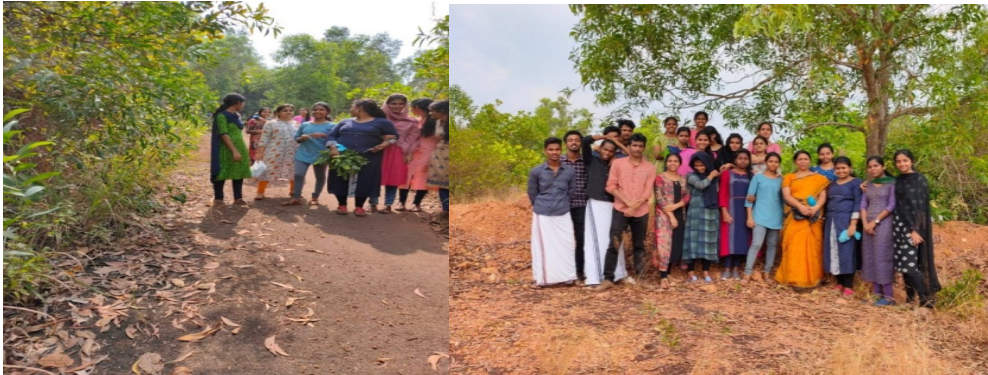

Seminar- Ripples

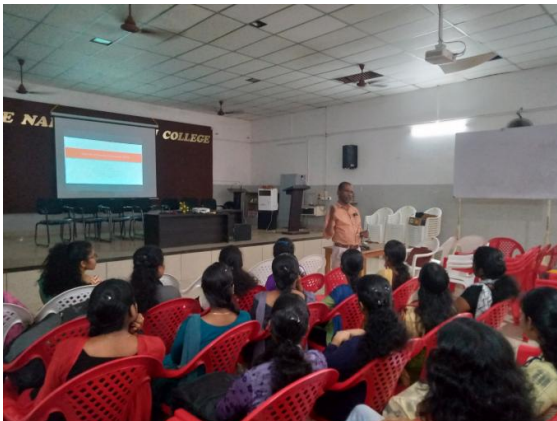
