




POSTGRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH - RIPPLES 2024-25

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES







Educational Visit to Regional Agricultural Research Station (RARS), Ambalavayal, Wayanad

Date of Visit: 28th February 2025 Organized by: PG Department of Biology, Sree Narayana Guru College, Chelannur Accompanied by Faculty Members:- Mrs. Yamuna V.G (Assistant Professor)- Ms. Anjana Vijayan (Assistant Professor).

Objective of the Trip: The study trip was aimed at providing postgraduate students with practical exposure to ongoing agricultural research, especially in plant biotechnology and breeding, thereby bridging theoretical knowledge with real-world application.

Summary of Activities: A group of 20 MSc Biology students visited the Regional Agricultural Research Station (RARS) in Ambalavayal, Wayanad. The institution, established in 1946 and currently under the Kerala Agricultural University, focuses on crop improvement, molecular

biology, and agronomy, especially for the high-range zones of Kerala. Upon arrival, the students were warmly welcomed by:- Mrs. Sameera Karumbanil- Dr. Soumya P.R (Assistant Professors, Plant Biotechnology) Detailed sessions and demonstrations were led by:- Dr. M. Amarantha Reddy (Assistant Professor, Plant Breeding and Genetics) The students were introduced to:- Modern tissue culture techniques- Research methods on pepper, ginger, turmeric, rice, and cool-season vegetables- Advanced equipment for soil fertility analysis and weather monitoring- Active state and national-level research projects funded by ICAR, NHM, SHM, RKVY, IMD, and the Government of Kerala Outcomes and Learnings:- Insight into the functional structure of a working agricultural research station- Practical exposure to biotechnology experiments, including tissue culture- Understanding the real-time application of crop breeding and variety development- Awareness of sustainable farming initiatives and multi-enterprise farming models for Wayanad The interaction with scientists and the hands-on observation of lab setups enriched the academic knowledge and sparked research interests among students.

Special Highlights:- Observation of high-yielding ginger varieties like Rio-de-Janeiro and Maran - Study of pure line selection in rice (WND I & WND II)- Awareness of the station's contribution towards addressing agrarian crises through innovation

Conclusion: The study trip to RARS, Ambalavayal, was a highly educational and inspirational experience. It deepened the students' understanding of agricultural sciences and modern research methods.









DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS

FIELD TRIP TO KADALUNDI BIRD SANCTUARY

In 2024, World Migratory Bird Day was celebrated on 11 May and 12 October. In connection with this the department of Zoology conducted a One Day field trip on 19 November 2024 (best time to visit the place is from November to March) for the students of Dept. of Botany to Kadalundi Bird Sanctuary, which lies in Kadalundi grama panchayat of Kozhikode district and Vallikunnu grama panchayat of Malappuram district in Kerala. The sanctuary, a scenic island with migratory birds, panoramic hill views, and playful otters in serene surroundings. A haven for over 60 different species of migratory birds, it is a paradise for bird watchers. The objective of this field trip was to raise awareness about the conservation of migratory birds, their habitat, and the identification of bird species. Apart from bird watching we also aimed to examine the sanctuaries wetland ecosystem including Mangroves and Forest mud plants. The students identified the eight mangrove species present there. The dominant species of mangroves include *Avicennia officinalis*, *Rhizophora mucronata* and *Acanthus ilicifolius*. The Bird Sanctuary is a unique and fascinating destination for nature lovers and bird enthusiasts. With its rich biodiversity; conservation efforts also enhanced the students to understand the balance of nature with humans and animals.







FIELD TRIP TO KMCT MEDICAL COLLEGE

An anatomy museum visit was conducted for the students who selected their Minor group as Zoology on 25/03/2025 in connection with World Health Day (April 7). The objective of the visit was to know the importance of our life, to know various types of disease and how it effects our body, to know and get training on certain life skills like adult CPR, pediatric CPR, neonatal resuscitation etc. The field visit provided the students an insightful and hands on experience, which enhanced their understanding in the field of medical research and the practical applications of certain life skills. 




DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS






• Ripples 2025 (21.02.2025)


Conclusion

SUNSPOT OBSERVATION






ASSOCIATION INAUGURATION

- Assessment and Exams: Upcoming mid-term exams were highlighted, and parents were encouraged to ensure their children were preparing adequately.


5. Discussion on Student Development










Koot -Freshers Day






Akkitham Poems Re-reading Session (24.10.2024)

Kunnolam Sneham (25.03.2025)








SEMINAR ON MACRO ECONOMIC IMPLICATIONS OF UNION BUDGET 2024-25

PRASANTH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP












EXTENSION ACTIVITY








BUDGET REVIEW








INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY- JUNE 21



NCC Army Wing of Sree Narayana Guru College observed Yoga day on 21st June along with Naval wing and NSS unit of SNGC.







INDEPENDENCE DAY







.The following are the **objectives** of the club:


- To help students achieve their full potential by addressing their unique needs and challenges.






K. Principal Dr. Kumar S P presided over the session. The NSS Program officers coordinated the function. In this program, 120 NSS volunteers participate




World AIDS Day Dec 1st









Human Rights Day Dec 10th




National Youth Day







PROGRAMME REPORT- I






CODE OF CONDUCT MONITORING COMMITTEE REPORT OF AWARENESS PROGRAMME




YOUNG INNOVATORS PROGRAMME (Y.I.P)


















RIPPLES SEMINAR SERIES 2024-25 : CONSOLIDATED REPORT


Key highlights of the session included:


This webinar, part of the Ripples Webinar Series, effectively highlighted the significance of staying current with technological trends to foster industrial development and innovation.







The webinar concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Divya N. K., expressing gratitude to the speaker, participants, and organizers for their valuable contributions.




MT Kadhayum Kalavum' – Ripples Seminar Series 2025


Harvesting Festival (April 5, 2025)


PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION (22.11.2024)



SPECIAL SALING CAMP-COASTAL (16.12.2024)



NATURE CLUB REPORT



FORESTRY CLUB REPORT 2024-25

On 28/01/2025 Members of Forestry Club visited Vallikattukavu. A temple with sacred grooves. Vallikkattu Kavu, a sacred grove in Kozhikode, Kerala, is approximately 27 acres in size. It's located in a swamp at Olayinmal Chikkilode, Edakkara, near Elathur. The grove is known for its diverse ecosystem, including various animal and plant species. Here we conducted a natural trail. Students noticed the plants, the water sources originating from the hills. Here a peculiar type of swamp ecosystem persists known as Myristica swamps. The common plants in the swamps are Myristica malabarica, Myristica beddomei, Knema attenuata etc.

In Vallikattukavu sacred groove exhibits a low land evergreen forest structure, with dominant tree species like *Myristica malabarica*, *Lagerstroemia microcarpa*, *Lophopetalum wightianum*, and *Carallia brachiata*. It also harbors endemic species like *Hopea ponga*, *Ancistrocladus heyneanus*, *Holigarna arnottiana*, Memecylon *umbellatum*, and *Gymnostachyum febrifugum*, along with numerous medicinal plants. The Students noted the plants and took girth of the plant to know how much biomas it can have in a sacred groove.
